What is the Summer School?

The School is a five-day residential program that brings together union women who are rank-and-file members, staff, and officers to strengthen their knowledge and understanding of the American labor movement in an effort to develop skills that will prepare them to be more active union members and leaders.

Why should you attend the Summer School?

Today, women make up almost half of all union members. In a few years, women will be in the majority.

Education is an essential tool to develop new activists and leaders who will grow and transform the labor movement.

When and where will the School be held?

Sponsored by the United Association for Labor Education (UALE) and the Murphy Institute for Worker Education and Labor Studies of the City University of New York (CUNY), the School will be held on the campus of CUNY's Queens College, in Flushing, New York, July 26 to July 31, 2014.

What will the School offer?

Each student will choose from workshops designed to teach and improve leadership skills. In addition, students will participate in panel discussions and have the opportunity to interact with union women activists and leaders from the Northeast Region. Throughout the week, experts on current union issues are invited as guest speakers to share their knowledge. Evening

activities and events provide opportunities to network.

Summer School instructors are union officers, staff, and labor educators from universities and unions.

Two- and four-day workshops offer training in union-related skills such as collective bargaining, griev-



ance handling and organizing. In addition, students will acquire personal leadership skills in such areas as public speaking, communications, and social media. They will gain knowledge about economics, labor law, and politics as well current social and political issues, including global economics, safety and health, and labor-community alliances.

Accommodations and Fees

Students can live on campus in the recently constructed Summit Dormitory. All rooms and campus facilities are non-smoking and handicapped accessible. Each air-conditioned suite has four bedrooms,

two bathrooms, a kitchen, and a living area. Both single and double



bedrooms are available. Single rooms are limited, subject to a first-come, first-served basis at a somewhat higher fee than doubles. The conference fee includes accommodations, meals, all workshops and activities, and internet access. For conference fees, see the registration section, below.

Cancellation and Refunds

All cancellations must be received in writing by letter, email, or fax. Full refunds, minus a \$35 cancellation fee, are available until July 1, 2014. Cancellations made after July 1, 2014 will incur an additional \$100 charge. Registered participants who fail to cancel in writing prior to the start of the Summer School and do not attend the program (i.e. no-shows) will not receive a refund except in extreme circumstances, evaluated on a case-by-case basis.
